## Re: Hupacasath Sign

It appears to the Tseshaht that the Alberni Toyota outlet has a sign on the Old Island Highway side of your property which creates the impression that the Hupacasath are the traditional owners of the Alberni Valley. The Tseshaht take exception to this.

The Tseshaht have never signed a treaty with The Crown. We continue to enjoy and exercise our aboriginal title and rights over our traditional territories. The Tseshaht traditional territories, to which we hold aboriginal title, include, *among others*, the Alberni Valley and surrounding areas. We have filed a claim with the Federal and Provincial Governments and that claim has been accepted for negotiation.

By erecting the sign on your property, you are clearly supporting the position of the Hupacasath. The Tseshaht object to this and regret the position you have taken. We call for the sign to be taken down immediately.

The more than 1,100 members of the Tseshaht have overwhelmingly supported the businesses of the Alberni Valley over the years. We regret that you have chosen to imperil the relationship between the Tseshaht people and Alberni Toyota. The less than 300 members of the Hupacasath have made a claim that we view as false and misguided.

Our First Nation will hold a regular monthly meeting on February 17 and consider our relationship with

Alberni Toyota at that time.
